The Grand Inquest for our Sovereign Lord the King that now
is for Lancaster County aforesaid — upon their Oath &
Affirmation respectively do present That Wendal Rininger of
the Borough of Lancaster in Lancaster County Yeoman
the tenth — Day of September in the second year of the
Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third King of Great Britain France
& Ireland Defender of the Faith &c. & divers other Days & Times as well
before as after at the Borough of Lancaster in the County aforesaid & within
the Jurisdiction of this Court did keep a Tipping House without
being first recommended by the Justices of the Court of General Quarter
Sessions of the Peace for the County of Lancaster in their said Court
to the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Pennsylvania for the time being for
his Licence for so doing or without obtaining such Licence & then & there
without such Recommendation or Licence did sell & deliver & cause
to be sold & delivered to sundry Persons divers Quantities of Wine
Rum and other Strong Spirits by Cup measure, than one Quart each
against the Form of the Acts of General Assembly of this Province
in such Case made & provided and against the Peace of our said
Lord the King his Crown & Dignity &c.
