do hereby authorize an empower any Attorney at Law, of any Court of Record in the State of Pennsylvania, or elsewhere, to appear for us at the suit of the said Commonwealth; and after one or more declarations filed on the above obligation, for the above mentioned penalty, thereupon to confess judgment or judgments, for as much of said penalty as may be due, in accordance with said Acts of Assembly, in one or more counties, against us, our Heirs, Executors or Administrators, as of any term or time past, or to any subsequent term, with cost of suit, by *non sum informatus nullo* or otherwise, as to any of them shall seem meet. Hereby releasing all errors, misprisons, misentries, defects, or imperfections whatsoever, that shall or may happen in entering the said judgment or judgments, or issuing execution thereon, or in any other the proceedings thereunto relating
