KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS,

That ~~we~~, *Peter Albrecht*

in the County of Lancaster, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the sum of *Five* Hundred DOLLARS for the uses, intents and purposes appointed and declared in and by an Act of Assembly, entitled "An Act to regulate the sale of intoxicating liquors," approved March 31, A. D. 1836, and the supplement thereto, approved April 20, A. D. 1858. To which payment, well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

The Condition of this Obligation is such,

That if the said *Peter Albrecht*
after he shall be duly authorized to sell liquors in pursuance of the above recited acts, will justly and faithfully observe all the laws of this Commonwealth relating to the business of vending such liquors until the *26th* day in *April 1863* next, then this obligation to be void; otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

And further, WE, the above bounden *Peter Albrecht,*

do hereby authorize and empower any Attorney at Law, of any Court of Record in the State of Pennsylvania, or elsewhere, to appear for us at the suit of the said Commonwealth; and after one or more declarations filed on the above obligation, for the above mentioned penalty, thereupon to confess judgment or judgments, for as much of said penalty as may be due, in accordance with said Acts of Assembly, in one or more counties, against us, our Heirs, Executors or Administrators, as of any term or time past, or to any subsequent term, with cost of suit, by *non sum informatus nolle* or otherwise, as to any of them shall seem meet. Hereby releasing all errors, misprisons, misentries, defects, or imperfections whatsoever, that shall or may happen in entering the said judgment or judgments, or issuing execution thereon, or in any other the proceedings thereunto relating.

THE PETITION OF THE UNDERSIGNED RESPECTFULLY REPRESENTS:

That he is desirous of keeping a Hotel, Inn, or Tavern in the Township of Merwin in said county, to accommodate the public and entertain strangers and travellers; that he has for the exclusive use of travellers two or more beds, and that he is a citizen of the United States.
