Complaint for Non-citation & Harassment

Thomas Langan

Defendant,

and Eleanor Langan of the City of Lancaster,

of

each acknowledge to owe and be indebted to the Commonwealth, for the use of the County of Lancaster, in the sum of three hundred dollars

to be levied of their goods and chattels, lands and tenements, upon condition that Thomas Langan — said defendant be and appear in his proper person at the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace, to be held for said County, in the City of Lancaster, on the 3d Monday in November, 1862, at 10 o'clock, A.M., then and there to answer such things as shall be objected against said Defendant, on behalf of the Commonwealth for one

and not depart said Court without leave, then this RECOGNIZANCE to be void, otherwise to be in full force and virtue.
