for the present be dispensed with; and many of them, to evince the warmth and disinterestedness of their attachment, refused to be considered as creditors for each part of their respective salaries as were then in arrears.

The French king, in his way to Clerbourg, stopped while the post-horses were getting ready at a village in Normandy; when a young and very handsome woman approached his majesty, and requested with great ease and politeness the honour of a kiss from her sovereign. The favour being immediately granted, she said, "Sire, my happiness is not yet complete. The widow of the late blacksmith of our village has ten children, for whom she is unable to provide the common necessaries of life; and I am desirous by the pardon to be commended her to your majesty's attention." The king took down the names of the solebreifs and of the widow, and promised faithfully to remember both the kids and the mothers of the ten children.

His majesty's humanity was also displayed at Clerbourg. In launching the cone, one man was killed and eight dangerously wounded; being his first son in ordinary massacred by their distress, he hid to him,—"why dost you run to the assistance of these poor people, their sense of pain is equal to yours or mine. It is necessary for me to remind you, that you are a man, and should feel for all your fellow-creatures!"

Feb. 21. This day his majesty went in the usual manner to the house of peers, and gave the royal assent to the crown land bill, the ship owners bill, the distiller bill, &c. &c. after which his majesty delivered the following most gracious speech:

"My lords and gentlemen,
"I cannot close this session of parliament without expressing the particular satisfaction with which I have observed your diligent attention to the public business, and the measures you have adopted for improving the resources of the country.

"Gentlemen of the house of commons,
"I thank you for the supplies which you have voted for the service of the current year, and for the manner you have shewn for distributing the incomes on the revenue applicable to the use of government. The most salutary effects are produced from the plan adopted for the reduction of the public debt; an act which I have the pleasure to observe has been carried into effect.

power and revenue, is equal to the government above-mentioned. The king's majesty adds, that the Dutch interest in the East India Company has rapidly increased since the late treaty of peace; and that they have made several advantageous alliances with the Rajahs on the Malabar coast.

June 19. The death of the king of Portugal does not make any vacancy in the crown of that kingdom, the Queen Isabella being sovereign in her own right. Her late husband was her father's youngest brother, who married his niece by dispensation from the pope for the purpose of continuing the Braganza line. The present prince of Brazil, heir to the crown, also married his aunt.

The grand-mother of Malta has sent, as a present, a small rich and costly bracelet of rubies, to madame du Freney, in token of her extraordinary and gallant conduct when an Algerian corsair attacked the vessel in which she was passenger. This lady was in a Tartan bound for Genoa, and a corsair making towards the Eartne, poured into her a broadside, and then grasping her, several of the Algerines boarded her. In the midst of this, when madame du Freney, snatching a fabric from a wounded sailor, exercised it with astonishing courage. The crew, animated and inspired by so unexpected an example of female valour, fought with enthusiasm, and drove the pirates back on board their own vessels. Soon after madame du Freney was on shore, the marquis de St. Christan waited on her, and with his own hands placed a crown of laurel upon her head, and a portrait of this lady has been since taken for the queen of France.

The king of Prussia, with that attention to the interests of his people which has ever actuated him, has ordered a sum of 500,000 crowns to be employed in improvements in West-Prussia; and another sum of 100,000 crowns to be laid out in the construction of a canal near Berlin, which will prevent those inundations to which that city used to be very much exposed. His majesty has had a severe relapse of his disorder, and when the last accounts came away his brother prince Ferdinand was at the point of death.

tended with dreadful consequences to them all, if a period was put to his existence.

They afterwards mounted him without any saddle on a mangle horse, which the day before had been rubbed with train oil and brimstone, and compelled him to carry his whip in his mouth. They then brought him once or twice into the field in order to take his life; but were, with the utmost difficulty, prevented from perpetrating the deed. They then carried him with great shouts and acclamations into an adjacent town, and gave him up to the sovereign; at whose house he remained a few days, until he found himself able to return to his own place of abode."

R I C H M O N D. September 6.
By a vessel arrived at Norfolk, in fifteen days from St. Bartholomew's, received the following proclamation:

By his excellency baron de Rayald, governor in and over the island of St. Bartholomew, and its dependencies.

WHEREAS from time to time we have observed, that numbers of foreigners residing through the different islands in our vicinity, make a practice of purchasing cargoes of lumber, &c. and sending it to these islands for the convenience of exportation, whereby it evidently appears that our late settlers and inhabitants of this colony, are deprived of those privileges and advantages, which they only, and no others are justly entitled to; and as we are well persuaded of the chief will, inclination and intent of our gracious king and sovereign, and his very particular wish and desire, to promote and benefit all our inhabitants and late settlers; as also those who may in future throw themselves under his royal and beneficent protection, we do hereby enact and make known, to all whom it may or doth concern, That henceforward both natives and foreigners, not residing in this our colony, but in foreign dominions, shall pay the lawful and just tribute or duty of two and an half per cent on articles of commerce, excepting West-India produce in general, so imported and exported.

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The microfilm of which this roll constitutes a part reproduces original tax records now in the custody of the Lancaster County Historical Society. Totalling sixty-eight boxes and seven volumes, these records were created during the assessment and collection of taxes in the political subdivisions of that county. They were transferred to the historical society by the Lancaster County Commissioners in 1961.

The bulk of these records, amounting to sixty-seven boxes and dating from the period 1748-1855, are of the following subdivisions (townships unless otherwise identified) which remain today in Lancaster County:
