LANCASTER COUNTY II.

To *Nathan Thompson* Assessor of *Sadsbury* Township,

PURSUANT to the direction of an Act of the General Assembly of this Commonwealth entitled "An act to provide for the enumeration of the taxable inhabitants and Slaves, within this commonwealth," Passed March the 7th. A. D. 1800, You are enjoined & required within *sixty* days after the date hereof, to make out *two* compleat LISTS in alphabetical order, containing a just and true account of the names and surnames of every taxable person, of the age of twenty one years and upwards, whether male or female residing within your township: And you shall also carefully and accurately take a separate LIST of all Negroes, Mulatoes and People of colour, held as slaves within your township, distinguishing their sexes and as near as may be their several ages; And twenty days previous to your making your return to the commissioners you shall cause a correct alphabetical LIST signed by you, containing the names and surnames of the taxable inhabitants together with their several occupations actually residing within your Township, to be set up at five of the most Public places within the same, for the inspection of all concerned.

Fail not,—for if you wilfully or negligently fail in performing the duties enjoined upon you by the above recited act, or under colour of performing such duties, make a false return to the Commissioners, you shall forfeit and pay the sum of 100 dollars.

N. B. Before you enter on the duties of your office, you are to take before some Judge or Justice of the peace of your county, the following oath or affirmation viz. "I A. B. do solemnly swear or affirm, that I will make a careful and accurate enumeration of all the taxable inhabitants and slaves actually residing within the district assigned to me, and make due return thereof to the Commissioners of the said county, agreeably to the directions of an act of the General Assembly of this Commonwealth entitled "An Act to provide for the enumeration of the taxable inhabitants and slaves within this Commonwealth" according to the best of my ability."

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

The microfilm of which this roll constitutes a part reproduces original tax records now in the custody of the Lancaster County Historical Society. Totalling sixty-eight boxes and seven volumes, these records were created during the assessment and collection of taxes in the political subdivisions of that county. They were transferred to the historical society by the Lancaster County Commissioners in 1961.

The bulk of these records, amounting to sixty-seven boxes and dating from the period 1748-1855, are of the following subdivisions (townships unless otherwise identified) which remain today in Lancaster County:

The remaining records, comprising one box and seven volumes, are of townships which were formerly in Lancaster County but are today in Dauphin and/or Lebanon counties (erected in 1785 and 1813, respectively). These particular records date from a shorter period: that of 1750-1788. The townships to which they pertain, and the counties in which these townships are now located, are as follows:
